

Video feedback for coparents: Using the Lausanne Family Play tools in clinical contexts

The Lausanne Family Play (LFP) tools are well-established brief assessments that can be done with families both in clinic as well as in home or remotely via videoconference. The Lausanne Trilogue Play paradigm (LTP) was the first of these semi-structured play tasks, and along with its later adaptations, allows us to observe infants and older children interacting with their families. Parents can then benefit from video feedback about their child, their parenting, as well as their family dynamics, based on their family play assessment. Video feedback has been shown to improve the alliance with the clinician, increase compliance with recommendations, and shorten treatment times. As waitlists mount for children's mental health care, this rapid modality will allow for some families to get much-needed input and care. Clinical vignettes and case descriptions will play a central role in this interactive webinar.

Learning objectives:

- Understand the research and theory supporting the use of the LTP and its variants as assessment tools
- Review concepts such as the family alliance, coparenting and assessment
- Learn the system of clinical assessment of an LTP and determine segments to be used for video feedback
- Participants will learn about the structure and delivery of video feedback to the point of having foundational knowledge to begin doing this with their own clients, with supervision
